AVSI, a non-profit organization founded in 1972, implements **development and humanitarian aid projects in 40 countries, including Italy.**

Our vision: to work for a world where the person is the protagonist of his or her own integral development and that of his or her community, even in crisis and emergency contexts.

In 2022, we carried out **364 projects** to help more than **7 million direct beneficiaries**.

AVSI's main sectors of intervention are: **Education**, which for AVSI is the cornerstone of development, **Agriculture and food security**; **Child protection**; **Energy**; **Environment**; **Vocational training and job creation**; **Economic strengthening and livelihoods**; **Nutrition**; **Sustainable cities**; **Human rights, democracy and peace**; **Health**; **Water and sanitation**.

We managed €105,849,928 of private and institutional funds in 2022.

For every Euro we receive, 91.16 cents are allocated to projects, whilst 8.84 cents are used to cover operating costs.
